Rules:

1. Open to residents of Long Itchington parish, their families and all children attending schools & other village organisation
2. Decisions of judges will be final
3. The committee will take all possible care of exhibits but will not be held responsible for any loss or damage
4. Exhibitors should provide their own vases for display purposes wherever possible
5. All exhibits must remain staged throughout the Show
6. Exhibitors will be limited to 2 entries in any class
7. Display space for classes 14, 15, 16 and 17 is limited to 2ft x 2ft
8. There are no entry fees and awards will take the form of certificates and rosettes
9. Any donated or unclaimed items from Section 1 (excluding bowls & vases, etc) will be offered for sale at the end of the Show with any proceeds going towards the running costs of the Community Centre
10. Items from Sections 2, 3 and 4 must be collected at the end of the Show
11. Children are encouraged to participate in any of the classes identified in the Show Schedule and to check in accordingly. Additionally, classes 26 to 31 are specifically for children under the age of 12 on the day of the show.

1. All exhibits **must** be received by 7.00pm on Thursday 25th March 2010 at any of the addresses listed below
2. The minimum printed size is 6" x 4" and the maximum display size, including any mount, is A4 (i.e. 11¼" x 8¼" approx)
3. All pictures must be presented with the exhibitors' own titles on the front and their names on the rear
4. All pictures entered must have been taken by the exhibitors themselves
5. There is no restriction on the type of photograph i.e. Black & White or Colour, Film or Digital, Mobile Phone, etc.
6. Photographs will be judged by the public using a simple voting slip and an award made to the most popular picture in each class and to the most admired picture overall.
