Rules:

1. Open to residents of Long Itchington parish and their families. All Children who attend schools and other organisations in the village are welcome to take part even if their home is outside the parish.
2. The decision of the judges will be final.
3. The committee will take all possible care of exhibits but will not be held responsible for any loss or damage.
4. Vases will be provided although exhibitors should use their own wherever possible.
5. All exhibits must remain staged throughout the Show.
6. All of the exhibits will be sold by auction at the end of the Show with the proceeds used for the benefit of the Community Centre except for those classes marked with an asterisk (*).
7. Exhibitors will be limited to 2 entries in any class in Sections 1-5 but only 1 entry per class in Section 6 (Children).

Section 6C **8-11 years** - Enter any or all of classes 1-6

Section 6D - Enter if the work is by a group of four or more children, irrespective of age
